

A general election will be held on Tuesday, 24 March 2026.

Polling stations will be open on Tuesday, 24 March 2026 from 8:00 to 20:00.

Who can vote in the general election?

To be eligible to vote in the general election, you must meet the following conditions on election day:

- You must be at least 18 years of age.
- You must be a Danish citizen.
- You must be a permanent resident of Denmark, Greenland or the Faroe Islands.
- You must not be legally incompetent.

How to vote by post in the general election

You can already now vote by post in any municipality in Denmark. The deadline for postal votes is **Friday, 20 March at 16.00.**

To vote by post, you must bring valid identification, such as a polling card, health insurance card, passport or driving licence. You can therefore vote by post before you have received your polling card. You just need to bring another valid form of identification.

In Vejle Municipality you can vote by post at Vejle Borgerservice, Skolegade 1, 7100 Vejle:

Monday from 11.00-15.00

Tuesday from 11.00-17.00

Wednesday from 8.00-12.00

Thursday from 11.00-17.00

Friday from 8.00-12.00 (however on Friday, 20 March 2026 until 16.00)

On Saturday, 7 March and on Saturday, 14 March 2026, postal voting will be open from 10:00 to 13:00.

You can also vote by post at the cultural centres in Børkop, Egtved, Give and Jelling during the following periods:

Aids for postal voting

For postal voting, a voting booth with a height-adjustable table will be available.

A black felt-tip pen, a magnifying glass and an LED light will be available. A CCTV type magnifying device with screen will also be available at Borgerservice Vejle.

Aids at polling stations

Black felt-tip pens, magnifying glasses and LED lights will be available at all polling stations on election days. At 5 polling stations, one voting booth will be equipped with a height-adjustable table on election day.

This applies to the following polling stations:

- DGI-Huset
- Hældagerhallen
- Give Sports Centre
- Jelling-Bredagerskolen

- Egtved-Roberthus.
- On election day, the following polling stations will have one voting booth equipped with a CCTV type magnifying device with screen: DGI-Huset and Hældagerhallen.

Voting assistance

Anyone who requests assistance in voting in an election can receive help at the polling station.

Personal assistance in voting must, as a rule, be provided by two election officials or appointed representatives.

Instead, you can choose to be assisted by a person of your choice (a personal assistant). This can be a family member, a friend or a spouse. However, if you are assisted by a self-appointed personal assistant, an election official must also always be present when you cast your vote.

In order to get help to vote, you need to be able to communicate directly and unambiguously to the persons who will help you tick the box which party or candidate you want to vote for. It's not enough that it's written on a piece of paper you brought from home, for example, or that it's conveyed through an interpreter.

However, there is the possibility of personal assistance only by a personally appointed helper if:

- The voter expressly and unequivocally requests it; and
- The request is based on an immediately recognisable or documentable physical or mental disability.

How to vote at home

If you are unable to attend the polling station on election day due to illness or lack of mobility, you can vote at home. Postal voting will take place at home on **Tuesday, 17 March 2026, between 10.00 and 16.00.**

If you wish to take advantage of this option, please call Vejle Municipality's transport office on 76 81 21 00, ext. 4.

You can call **until Thursday, 12 March 2026 at 18.00.**

The telephone lines are open Monday to Thursday from 11.00 to 14.00 and Friday from 11.00 to 13.00. On Thursday, 12 March, however, the lines will be open until 18.00.

Transfer to another polling station

If you are disabled or have limited mobility, you can apply to vote on election day at another polling station in the municipality of Vejle. If you wish to take advantage of this option, please call Borgerservice on 7681 0156 or fill in an application form.

The application must be submitted no later than 12.00 on Monday, 16 March 2026.

How to book transport for elderly and infirm citizens

Elderly and infirm citizens in Vejle Municipality can be transported to polling stations free of charge on election day.

You can register for this service by calling Vejle Municipality's transport office on tel. 76 81 21 00, ext. 4.

You can call **until Thursday, 12 March 2026 at 18.00.**

The telephone lines are open Monday to Thursday from 11.00 to 14.00 and Friday from 11.00 to 13.00. On Thursday, 12 March, however, the lines will be open until 18.00.

Transport on election day will take place between 10:00 and 12:00 and between 15:00 and 17:00.

Polling card

Prior to an election, all eligible voters will receive a polling card.

Polling cards must be sent out to all voters by Thursday, 19 March 2026 at the latest.

If you have not received your polling card, you can go to your polling station on Tuesday, 24 March 2026 and bring identification, e.g. in the form of a health insurance card, driving licence or passport, and you will still be able to vote in the election.
